

About Greenfleet.

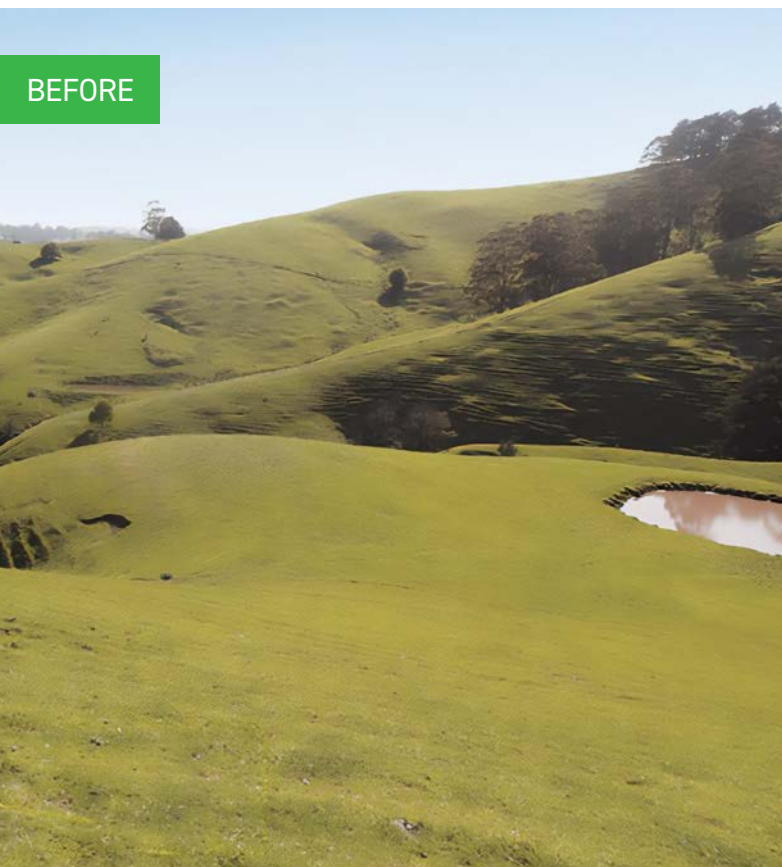
Greenfleet is a leading Australian not-for-profit environmental organisation protecting our climate by restoring our forests.

We plant native biodiverse forests to capture carbon emissions and help fight the impacts of climate change.

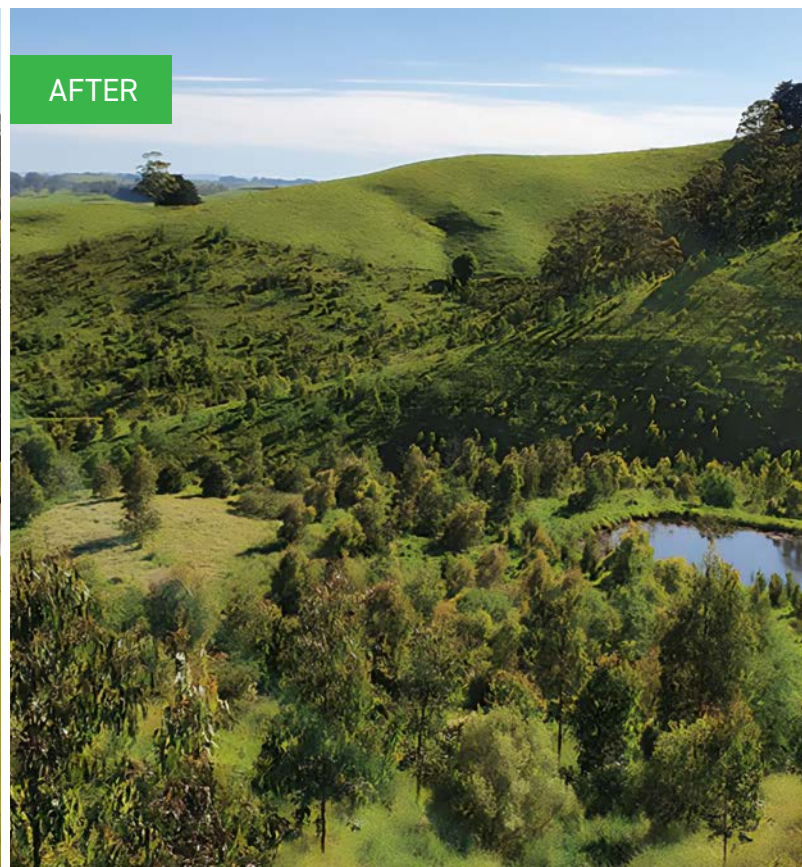
Greenfleet is Australia's first carbon offset provider and since 1997 has planted over 10.8 million trees creating more than 550 legally protected forests in Australia and New Zealand.

Our forests are legally protected for up to 100 years, conserving biodiversity and improving the health of our soils and waterways. They also address deforestation and restore habitat for native wildlife, including many endangered species.

Greenfleet grows forests and climate hope by empowering people to take tangible and long-lasting environmental action.

We've now restored over 550 native forests and in the past 12 months we've revegetated areas in Queensland, Victoria, South Australia, New South Wales and New Zealand.

CEO's Message

2023 was Greenfleet's biggest year yet for delivering climate action; removing carbon, restoring nature, and working to advance Reconciliation.

Our supporters have now offset more than 4.9 million tonnes of carbon, which will be removed throughout this century by the legally protected native ecosystems we've planted.

We've now restored over 550 native forests, and in the past 12 months we've revegetated areas in Queensland, Victoria, South Australia, New South Wales, and New Zealand.

As our work expands, we continue to see its positive environmental impact. Koalas were spotted in trees planted only two years ago in our forest called Greentrees in Northern New South Wales. In 2023 we restored an additional 493 hectares of koala habitat. These projects are pivotal, with koalas being endangered in Queensland, NSW and the ACT.

We progressed the restoration of the Strzelecki Nature Link in South Gippsland, Victoria. This project is creating 3.5 kilometres of contiguous koala habitat on Boon Wurrung Country. Our work at a nearby site called Glendalough is demonstrating how climate action and regenerative agriculture can co-exist for a more sustainable future.

While I could not be prouder of the nature-positive outcomes Greenfleet is delivering, it would be remiss not to reflect on the justified critique of the carbon market. Offsetting remains a crucial tool in the transition to a low carbon economy but the lack of integrity in some initiatives has shaken the confidence of organisations and consumers alike.

The alignment of carbon removal and the restoration of nature has always been the cornerstone of Greenfleet's approach. In a year that exposed unprecedented levels of greenwash and inauthentic action from others operating in our industry, we're glad to see that the focus is shifting towards nature focused climate action.

Authentic, nature-based offsets are a key part of reaching net-zero and drawing down on the carbon already in our atmosphere. Greenfleet's Australia and New Zealand offsets do exactly this. They cannot be traded, are audited annually by Pitcher Partners, and assured by EY.

Greenfleet was deeply disappointed by the results of the Voice to Parliament Referendum, and we remain dedicated to advancing Reconciliation through our work.

In 2023, we maintained our steadily developing relationships with Indigenous communities. We're successfully delivering the Indigenous Land Use Agreement with the Kabi Kabi people in Noosa, have entered productive discussions with the Boon Wurrung people about our work in South Gippsland, and advanced our own Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP).

This was also a big year for our staff, with our team growing to 23 across Victoria, New South Wales, and Queensland. We reshaped our organisation to include a Deputy CEO who will focus on running the business successfully through these changing times.

We welcomed David Lamb as the inaugural Chair of Greenfleet's Alumni Network; a group that holds a deep passion for our work. Many alumni have been with Greenfleet through much of our history.

We were saddened by the loss of the Hon. Tom Roper. Tom was a warrior on many fronts and a long-standing Greenfleet Board member. We honour his contribution to our organisation and the wider community.

I'm grateful to our Supporters, Board, Business Advisory Council, Partners, and Staff for being part of the Greenfleet community. Together, we are growing our forests and growing climate hope.

Our Impact: 2023

In 2023, Greenfleet restored native forests across **608 hectares** to remove **513,887 tonnes** of carbon over their lifetime.

This equates to removing around **120,000 average cars** from Australia's roads for a whole year.

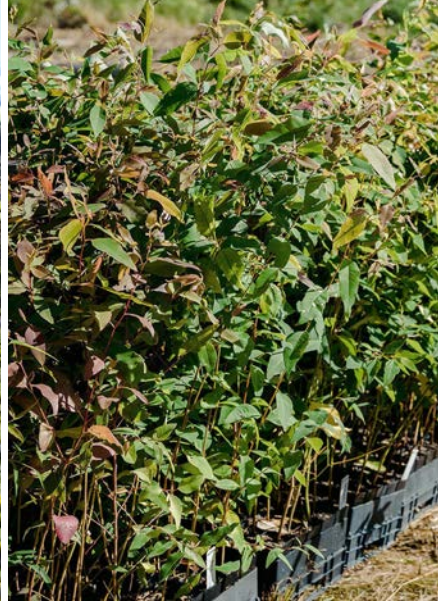

2023 Planting Projects

Glendalough (VIC)

Boon Wurrung Country

In the rolling hills of South Gippsland, vast parts of this 240-hectare site are being returned to native forest. With a working farm operating on this property, this revegetation project demonstrates the potential for sustainable agriculture to go hand in hand with climate action.

Adjacent to remnant native vegetation, this project will provide a potential habitat link for Strzelecki Koalas and native birds such as the Yellow-faced Honeyeater and Grey Fantail. Its location at the headwaters of the Tarwin River Catchment also means the revegetation will help minimise land lost to erosion, enhance water retention, and improve water quality. This will also support several riparian and freshwater wildlife species found in the region.

Ngulambarra (VIC)

Dja Dja Wurrung Country

Ngulambarra means “meeting place” in Djaara language. This property is located in Central Victoria near Wedderburn and forms a key part of the Wychitella Biolink. The project is improving biodiversity and building habitat for the region’s wildlife. Since 2020, over 200 hectares have been restored to native forest including 20 hectares planted with native grasses that can be cultivated for traditional use.

In 2023, further planting took place at Ngulambarra to include rare and declining plant species. Some of the species planted include Heath Myrtle (*Micromyrtus ciliata*), Rosy Baeckea (*Euromyrtus microphylla*) and Spiny Rice-Flower (*Pimelea spinescens*); a critically endangered species.

Yurol Ringtail (QLD)

Kabi Kabi Country

In 2021, Greenfleet entered a landmark Indigenous Land Use Agreement with the Kabi Kabi Peoples Aboriginal Corporation to revegetate over 1,000 hectares in the Noosa Hinterland.

With support from the Principal Partner, GPT Group, this project brings together climate action, reconciliation, and restoration of critical koala and Greater Glider habitat.

Revegetation in 2023 built on work that began in 2022. We will return in 2024 to continue this project that is restoring protected native ecosystems while delivering economic benefits to the Kabi Kabi people. The Aboriginal Carbon Foundation verifies the social and cultural benefits identified by Traditional Owners.

Dangerbridge

(QLD)

Kabi Kabi Country

Dangerbridge is located north of Queensland’s iconic Noosa region. Demonstrating our long-term commitment to ecosystem restoration and climate action, Greenfleet first planted here in 2003, returning in 2021 and 2023 to expand the revegetation area at the site.

As well as capturing carbon, this forest is extending wildlife habitat from the Coloola National Park. The native forest is improving habitat connectivity along Kin Kin Creek and enhancing koala habitat and food tree abundance. This work is pivotal as koalas are classified as endangered in Queensland.

Bromfields Road

(VIC)

Boon Wurrung Country

Adjoining Lang Lang River in South Gippsland, this project forms part of the Strzelecki Nature Link as it connects to Greenfleet’s forest at Wurneet Laang Laang. Made up of four Greenfleet owned properties, once established, the Strzelecki Nature Link will form 3.5 km of contiguous koala habitat.

The property at Bromfields Road spans 37 hectares, and the project will provide critical habitat for the Swift Parrot and Strzelecki Koala. It is also a restoration opportunity for the critically endangered Strzelecki Gum (*Eucalyptus strzeleckii*); a tree species endemic to this unique area.

Harmony Way

(VIC)

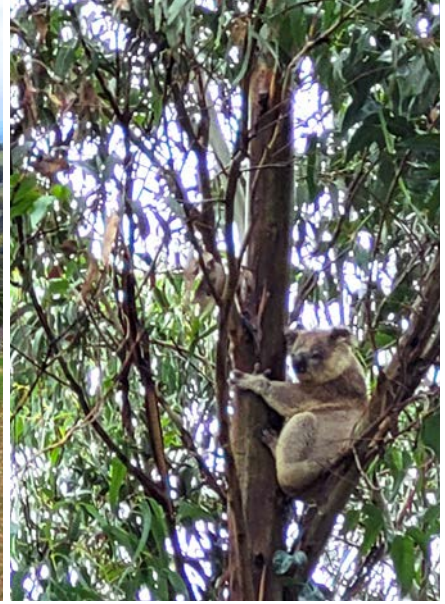
Dja Dja Wurrung Country

Located in Central Victoria, this site was previously cleared for grazing and is now being restored to a legally protected native ecosystem. Across this property, Greenfleet has restored Low Rise Grassy Woodland, a vulnerable vegetation community.

Multiple locally native species were planted here in 2023, including the River Red Gum (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) and Bull Oak (*Allocasuarina luehmannii*); a critical food source for birds such as the Red-tailed Black Cockatoo.

While delivering climate action by removing carbon, this forest will build and extend habitat for species such as the Squirrel Glider, Regent Honeyeater and Brush-tailed Phascogale.

Ivory Creek

(QLD)

Yuggera Country

Located north-west of Brisbane, Greenfleet's work in this region began in 2022. In 2023, Greenfleet continued the restoration of the riparian and floodplain ecosystems. With existing koalas confirmed on the property, this work will extend habitat for the endangered species.

Greenfleet has planted 25 locally native species across these properties including Moreton Bay Ash (*Corymbia tessellaris*), Weeping Bottlebrush (*Melaleuca viminalis*) and Forest Red Gum (*Eucalyptus tereticornis*); a vital koala food source in Queensland.

While this project delivers significant climate action, the native restoration along Ivory Creek will improve water quality and reduce erosion in this section of the Brisbane River catchment.

Lyrebird

(VIC)

Kurnai Country

Located in Boolarra South, the restoration of this property is building on Greenfleet's work in the Gippsland region. Previously cleared for grazing, this site is being revegetated to deliver climate action and extend wildlife habitat.

Species that will benefit from this work include koalas, the Swift Parrot, the Gang-gang Cockatoo, and the Greater Glider, an endangered species that has been heavily impacted by land clearing.

Over 20 locally native species have been planted, including the critically endangered Strzelecki Gum (*Eucalyptus strzeleckii*); a tree species endemic to this unique area.

Jumbuk

(VIC)

Kurnai Country

Located in Gippsland, the project at Jumbuk will see the restoration of habitat for koalas and the White-throated Needletail, a bird classified as vulnerable in Victoria. Other species that will benefit from this revegetation work include the Long-nosed Bandicoot, Gang-gang Cockatoo, and the endangered Greater Glider.

While removing carbon to deliver climate action, this project will help bolster existing native ecosystems on the site. The revegetation will also help link habitat with the Morwell National Park and Strzelecki State Forest, allowing wildlife to move safely through the region.

Mareeba Wetlands (QLD)

Muluridgi Country

Located west of Cairns within the Mareeba Wetlands Nature Reserve, this project is re-establishing the native ecosystem found in the region. This restoration project began in 2023 and will continue over the coming years. Species planted so far include Brown Salwood (*Acacia mangium*) and Large-Fruit Mahogany (*Eucalyptus pellita*), which will be critical in forming the forest canopy.

The Mareeba Wetlands offer critical conservation opportunities for more than 220 species of birds, as well as frogs, reptiles, and fish. Through this project, we will be supporting restoration of an area with one of the highest mammal diversities in the Cape York region, including the endangered Northern Quoll.

Brown Creek (QLD)

Yuggera Country

Located west of Brisbane in Grandchester, this project is restoring native forest on land previously used for grazing. The project is extending remnant vegetation on the property already providing habitat to koalas and many native bird species.

In 2022 and 2023, Greenfleet supporters helped revegetate this site with 14 different locally native species, including Weeping Bottlebrush (*Melaleuca viminalis*), Black Wattle (*Acacia concurrens*) and Forest Red Gum (*Eucalyptus tereticornis*); a primary food source for endangered koalas in South-East Queensland.

Ledcourt (VIC)

Jardwadjali & Djabwurung Country

This site is adjacent to the northern part of the Grampians National Park in Victoria. Previously cleared for sheep and cattle grazing, it is being restored to protected native forest. With some remnant native vegetation already present on the site, Greenfleet will work to restore the cleared areas and bolster the existing ecosystems with ground cover species.

The property adjoins Mount William Creek, which is home to platypus and other wildlife species known to the region including kangaroos, wallabies, echidnas and emus. In total, Greenfleet will revegetate up to 100 hectares to conserve biodiversity and extend habitat for native wildlife.

Bull Creek

(SA)

Ngarrindjeri Country

Located an hour north of Adelaide, the property at Bull Creek has been restored with the Peppermint Box Grassy Woodland ecosystem. This critically endangered ecosystem is home to more than 70 species of birds and other wildlife.

In 2023, Greenfleet restored 14 hectares of this property with locally native plant species to create habitat for rare and endangered wildlife that call this ecosystem home. This includes the endangered Southern Brown Bandicoot, the critically endangered Southern Emu-wren, and the vulnerable Yellow-footed Antechinus.

Tarwin Lower

(VIC)

Boon Wurrung Country

Building on Greenfleet's work in the Gippsland region, this revegetation project will extend habitat for a confirmed population of koalas on the property. This region is also home to wombats and Eastern Grey Kangaroos.

The restoration of this site will help create a habitat link between Middle Creek and Ten Mile Creek. It will also enhance the existing habitat around the property, providing stepping stones for species including the Swamp Antechinus, White-bellied Sea Eagle and Powerful Owl, to move safely throughout the region.

Upcoming Projects

A selection of Greenfleet's 2024 projects is included below to demonstrate the work we are continuing to deliver on behalf of our supporters:

Back O'Slaters (NSW)

Gundungurra & Dharug Country

Demonstrating Greenfleet's long-term approach to native reforestation and climate action, we will return to Back O'Slaters in 2024 after first planting here in 2017. This project is restoring biodiversity in the Southern Tablelands and delivering climate action. Greenfleet will make a further environmental impact by extending this forest and replanting some areas that have been affected by bushfire.

Ivory Flat (QLD)

Yuggera Country

While delivering climate action, the forest planted at Ivory Flat will improve connectivity along Ivory Creek in the Brisbane River Catchment. This project will extend habitat for koalas and Grey Headed Flying Foxes, two species that are endangered in Queensland. The reforestation work will improve water quality and deliver other far reaching environmental benefits.

Strzelecki Nature Link (VIC)

Boon Wurrung Country

Four Greenfleet owned properties form the Strzelecki Nature Link; Wurneet Laang Laang, Bromfields Road, Mt Emily, and Territory. Located within the Strzelecki Ranges and part of the upper catchment of the Lang Lang River, once fully restored, this project will form 3.5 kilometres of contiguous koala habitat. This area originally hosted the Ecological Vegetation Classes (EVC) of Damp Forest and Wet Forest – ecosystems that are dominated by towering Eucalypt species that can grow over 30 metres tall.

Wooden Hut (QLD)

Waka Waka & Barunggam Country

Located about two hours north of Toowoomba, the project called Wooden Hut will see the revegetation of more than 80 hectares of cleared land. Previously used for plantation planting and agriculture, it will now be returned to legally protected native forest, providing potential habitat for species including koalas, Grey-headed Flying Foxes, and Greater Gliders.
